No-Till Drill Available For Rent in Spring of 2024

The Districts Great Plains 10' No-Till Drill is put away for the winter, but will ready for rent by landowners within McKean County in the spring of 2024. The following rates have been established:

- \$12.00 per acre or \$24.00 per acre if used on conventional tilled ground.

- Free use of the drill up to 30 acres if planting a nonharvested cover crop.

The District will transport the drill; however, landowners leasing the drill will pay a \$25.00 delivery fee within McKean County.

When completed with the drill, clean all seed and fertilizer from machine. Failure to clean the drill will result in a \$25 clean out fee. Once cleaned contact the District to let them know the



equipment is ready to be picked up. An invoice will be mailed out after planting acreage has been determined.

Carbide Tipped Blade Available for Free to Municipalities



The Conservation District owns a carbide tipped blade that is available for use by all municipalities so that they can properly grade their road. There is no charge for use of this equipment. Compared to straight blades, carbidetipped blade systems more effectively cut hard surfaces and will typically cut deeper with each pass.

Carbide bits shatter rocks rather than pulling them out of the road The bits also grind off embedded rocks, allowing restoration of the road to the desired cross section and improving adhesion of gravel overlays.

Carbide-tipped blade systems offer numerous benefits

over traditional straight grader blades for maintenance grading operations. This is the preferred tool for maintaining a road surface.

2023 DSA & Road Maintenance Workshop

The District, in cooperation with the Pennsylvania State Conservation Commission, Penn State Center for Dirt and Gravel Road Studies, and the Potter County Conservation District held a free DSA and Road Maintenance Workshop for anyone who maintains unpaved roads on October 13th, 2023.

During the workshop, presentations were given on innovative and effective practices to reduce maintenance costs and sediment pollution from unpaved roads. Focus topics included a presentation on the Dirt and Gravel Programs DSA (driving surface aggregate) requirements. DSA Placement and Maintenance, Road Surface Maintenance, Ditch Maintenance and Invasive Plant Information. The workshop also included a live grading demonstration.

The workshop was held on Friday, October 13, 2023 at the Kane Fire Department. Municipal attendees received additional points towards the ranking of the Dirt, Gravel and Low Volume Road application. Attendees also earned 4 hours (1 year) for PA Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) continuing education credits.

2023 Erosion & Sedimentation Control in Our Forest Workshop

On Thursday October 12, 2023 the Annual Erosion and Sedimentation Control in our Forest Workshop was made possible through a multi-county effort of the Conservation Districts of Tioga, Potter, Cameron, Elk, and McKean Counties in cooperation with the PA Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) Implementation Committee and DCNR, Bureau of Forestry.

This is a workshop for foresters, loggers, logging contractors and private forest landowners to learn more about the fundamentals of erosion control, permitting, planning before a timber harvest, best management practices to implement during the harvest and stream crossing practices.

The 2023 workshop was help in Tioga County where there was 30 people in attendance. The day started with in-classroom learning then moved to the field to visit a retired timber harvest site. Topics covered the review of fundamentals for erosion control, permitting and stream considerations, how to plan before you harvest, using the SFI Timber Harvest Checklist, Best Management Practices (BMPS) and common site problems, and stream crossing BMPS.

ESM trainings are open to both new certifications and those seeking a recertification.

Eligible entities such as municipalities are required to complete this course every 5 years to be eligible to apply for PA Dirt, Gravel, and Low Volume Road Program grant funds through the Conservation District. The McKean County Conservation District was organized at the request of the County residents. The County was declared a District by the board of County Commissioners on August 19, 1959, according to provisions of the Soil Conservation Law of 1945, Act 217 of the General Assembly, as amended.

The primary goal of the District is the development, improvement, and conservation of the County's Soil, water and related resources as well as educating the community in various conservation and environmental practices and methods.

The District is administered by a board of seven Directors-three farmer members, three public (non-farmer) members and one County Commissioner. District Directors are appointed by the County Commissioners from a list of names submitted by countywide nominating organizations. The Commissioners also designate one of their members to serve as a Director.

Vision: The Conservation District is the steward of McKean County's natural resource and embraces environmentally responsible decisions.

Mission: The Conservation District provides leadership and stewardship to ensure the protection and sustainability of McKean County's natural resources by fostering public and private partnerships.
